CALVARY HOSPITAL – NEW DEVELOPMENTS

Sign the new Federal Parliamentary <u>e-petition</u> by August 31 to ask the Federal Parliament to override the ACT government's compulsory acquisition of Calvary Hospital.

The actions of the ACT government can be seen as an abuse of property rights and religious freedom.

There is serious concern among faith communities in Australia that this action will extend to the targeting of other faith, welfare and community groups without consultation.

For 170 years in Australia, the Catholic Church has served the community, established hospitals, and trained doctors, nurses and healthcare professionals. Today, 21 public and 54 private Catholic hospitals treat more than 1.5 million patients annually, or three patients every minute.

As the Federal Parliament has the authority to veto legislation passed by Territories of the Commonwealth, call on the House to override the ACT's take-over of Calvary Hospital.

I dismiss you from your office, I remove you from your post, and the same day I call on my servant Eliakim son of Hilkiah.


I invest him with your robe, gird him with your sash, entrust him with your authority;

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say the Son of Man is?' And they said, 'Some say he is John the Baptist, some Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he said 'who do you say I am?' Then Simon Peter spoke up, 'You are the Christ,' he said, 'the Son of the living God.' Jesus replied, 'Simon son of Jonah, you are a happy man! Because it was not flesh and blood that revealed this to you but my Father in heaven. So I now say to you: You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church. And the gates of the underworld can never hold out against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven: whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.' Then he gave the disciples strict orders not to tell anyone that he was the Christ.
