#### **RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF CHILDREN (RCIC)**

Most of us are baptized into the Catholic Church as infants or small children. For a number of reasons, other families wait for presenting their child for baptism. RCIC is a program of baptism preparation for children between the ages of 7-18 years. We accept that children reach the age of reason at 7-8 years. RCIC is a program designed for a person's emerging sense of independence and choice.

## **WORLD POLIO DAY. October 24:**

A polio-free world is possible. Only two countries remain polio-endemic countries. Strong immunisation systems are stopping transmission of poliomyelitis and sustaining eradication in most places. Our problem in Australia now is post-polio syndrome (PPS), affecting about 40 per cent of people who had 'paralytic' polio when young. Thirty to forty years later, symptoms can emerge suddenly after surgery or other periods of immobility, but the onset is normally slow and steady as new muscle weakness gradually worsens. Symptoms vary considerably in range and severity but can include muscle and joint pain, breathing problems, tendonitis, arthritis and severe fatigue, all of which can be confused as signs of old age. This condition needs to be addressed for our ageing polio population.
