

Oils will be supplied by the Cathedral; Parishes to bring their own clean bottles for collection of oils after Mass.

This year's Chrism Mass will also be an occasion to celebrate the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Diocese. To mark the occasion a commemorative Chrism cruet will be presented to each parish.

All parishioners of the Diocese are warmly invited to this very significant Mass for our Diocese. Light refreshments and beverages will be provided after the Mass on the Cathedral lawns.

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord – 24th March

God's love and compassion for all of humanity led Jesus to a savagely violent execution. Injustice led Jesus to suffer pain and indignity beyond our comprehension and yet he silently suffered for us. As Jesus was carrying the cross, a man called Cyrene, Simon, passing through was forced to carry the cross for Christ, this eased some of the burden. This Lent we are asked to ease the burden and to revere the dignity of the millions of people suffering across the world, we can carry their cross.



Christ said, "whatsoever you do to the least of my sisters and brothers, you do to me."

Over the past six weeks we have been asked to try and walk in the shoes of those suffering, to listen with open hearts, to understand that every person is 'God's work of art', to reach beyond the safe and familiar and this week in the words of a beautiful prayer that was taught to Pope Francis by his grand-mother: "Jesus, make my heart more like yours."

Over the past six weeks we have been introduced to three inspiring young women, Ronita from the Philippines, Leaia from Samoa and Memory from Malawi who faced and overcame incredible challenges. With the support of Caritas and the compassion of people who have opened their hearts
