Sandhurst Diocese Pilgrimage

On Palm Sunday March 24th Cathedral Cluster parishioners are invited to join in the Pilgrimage from St. Kilian's Church through the streets of Bendigo to Sacred Herat Cathedral to mark the 150th anniversary of the Diocese of Sandhurst and the commencement of Holy Week 2024.

The pilgrims will depart from St. Kilian's at 9.45am to arrive at the Cathedral in time for the 11am Mass and liturgy of Palm Sunday in the Cathedral.

Please Note: On Palm Sunday, March 24th, the 8.30am Mass at the Cathedral and the 9am Mass at St Monica's, Kangaroo Flat, have been cancelled, in order to facilitate participation in the important pilgrimage.

Those unable to walk the pilgrimage on Palm Sunday morning are warmly invited to join us at the cathedral for the Mass and liturgy @11 am. It occurs at conception when the extra chromosome 21 develops, making 47 chromosomes in the DNA. There is no cure and it does not go away. Everyone who has Down Syndrome will have some level of intellectual disability, but many young people go to school, then get a job – just like everybody else. 5th Sunday of Lent – 17th March



In the Gospel today, Jesus speaks of the grain of wheat that must die to create a rich harvest. He is laying down the principle that life always comes through death. It will be through his own death and resurrection that he will be glorified. Then when he is "lifted up," he will draw people to himself and salvation will be extended to all who believe, regardless of race or nationality.



In his letter *Fratelli Tutti*, Pope Francis wrote: "no one can face life in isolation" and that the time has truly come to "dream, then, as a single human family" in which we are "brothers and sisters all" (Par 8) and he asks us to treasure the hope found in every heart.

Hope is deeply rooted in every human heart, it gives us a reason to live, to dream, to love. We are called to wear our hearts on our sleeves, to reach beyond the safe and familiar.

FIRST READING

Jeremiah 31:31-34 A reading from the prophet Jeremiah

See, the days are coming – it is the Lord who speaks – when I will make a new covenant with the House of Israel and the House of Judah, but not a covenant like the one I made with their ancestors on the day I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt. They broke that covenant of mine, so I had to show them who was master. It is the Lord who speaks. No, this is the covenant I will make with the House of Israel when those days arrive - it is the Lord who speaks. Deep within them I will plant my Law, writing it on their hearts. Then I will be their God and they shall be my people. There will be no further need for neighbour to try to teach neighbour, or brother to say to brother, 'Learn to know the Lord!' No, they will all know me, the least no less than the greatest - it is the Lord who speaks – since I will forgive their iniquity and never call their sin to mind.

Among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. These approached Philip, who came from Bethsaida in Galilee, and put this request to him, 'Sir, we should like to see Jesus.' Philip went to tell Andrew, and Andrew and Philip together went to tell Jesus. Jesus replied to them:

'Now the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified.

I tell you most solemnly, unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain; but if it dies, it yields a rich harvest.

Anyone who loves his life loses it; anyone who hates his life in this world will keep it for the eternal life.

If a man serves me, he must follow me, wherever I am, my servant will be there too.

If anyone serves me, my Father will honour him. Now my soul is troubled.

What shall I say: Father, save me from this hour?

But it was for this very reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name!'

A voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.'

People standing by, who heard this, said it was a clap of thunder; others said, 'It was an angel speaking to him.' Jesus answered, 'It was not for my sake that this voice came, but for yours.

'Now sentence is being passed on this world; now the prince of this world is to be overthrown. And when I am lifted up from the earth, I shall draw all men to myself.' By these words he indicated the kind of death he would die.
