PROJECT COMPASSION 2024



2nd Sunday of Lent – 25 February

Jesus led his three disciples, Peter, James and John up a high mountain, where they were alone. He is transfigured before them, his clothes become radiantly white and God appears in an overshadowing cloud. A voice speaks to the three disciples,

"This is my son, whom I love. Listen to him!" This was a direct order given to the three and through them the rest of the twelve disciples. It has been suggested that as both God and man, Jesus reveals to us both what God is really like, and who we really are. If we 'listen to him', as today's Gospel asks us to do, we will notice that every word that he speaks, every miracle,



every action, shows us one, or both of these things.

This week we learn about the story of Ronita from the Philippines. Ronita's schooling was cut short when she became a mother at a young age. Her husband earns less than \$16.00 a day and Ronita, her husband and their two children are only able to rent a room of about 10 square metres. Thanks to the support of Project Compassion, Ronita's life can be transfigured, she has been able to continue her education through a program called Alternative Learning System (ALS), run by Caritas Australia's partner, the Faithful Companions of Jesus (FCJ).

Caritas Australia believes that the world can be transfigured to become more like the kingdom of God of which Jesus spoke. We can encounter people whom others choose to ignore. When we do so, we discover that here, too, are children of God. We are asked to listen to them.

A reading from the book of Genesis

God put Abraham to the test. 'Abraham, Abraham,' he called.' Here I am' he replied. 'Take your son,' God said 'your only child Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him as a burnt offering, on a mountain I will point out to you.'

When they arrived at the place God had pointed out to him, Abraham built an altar there, and arranged the wood. Then he bound his son Isaac and put him on the altar on top of the wood. Abraham stretched out his hand and seized the knife to kill his son.

But the angel of the Lord called to him from heaven. 'Abraham, Abraham' he said. 'I am here' he replied. 'Do not raise your hand against the boy' the angel said. 'Do not harm him, for now I know you fear God. You have not refused me your son, your only son.' Then looking up, Abraham saw a ram caught by its horns in a bush. A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

With God on our side who can be against us? Since God did not spare his own Son, but gave him up to benefit us all, we may be certain, after such a gift, that he will not refuse anything he can give. Could anyone accuse those that God has chosen? When God acquits, could anyone condemn? Could Christ Jesus? No! He not only died for us – he rose from the dead, and there at God's right hand he stands and pleads for us.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves. There in their presence he was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Rabbi,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say; they were so frightened. And a cloud came, covering them in shadow; and there came a voice from the cloud, 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Then suddenly, when they looked round, they saw no one with them any more but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain he warned them to tell no one what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. They observed the warning faithfully, though among themselves they discussed what 'rising from the dead' could mean.

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
