Liturgical Ministry Seminars:

3 workshops are being offered at St. Kilian's Parish in Bendigo on Wednesday 7 February, 5:30pm start and repeated on Saturday, 10 February 10:30am start.

Plenary Keynote Presentation. Pope Francis' Apostolic Letter *Desiderio Desideravi* (2022) on Liturgical Formation of the People of God invites renewed reflection on the preparation and celebration of the Church's liturgy. In this keynote address, Prof. Clare Johnson, Director of the ACU Centre for Liturgy will provide an overview of Pope Francis' letter and suggest some implications for liturgical ministries.

This will be followed by a choice of 3 workshop options:

READINGS OF THE DAY

FIRST READING Jonah 3:1-5. 10

A reading from the prophet Jonah

The word of the Lord was addressed to Jonah: 'Up!' he said 'Go to Nineveh, the great city, and preach to them as I told you to.' Jonah set out and went to Nineveh in obedience to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was a city great beyond compare: it took three days to cross it. Jonah went on into the city, making a day's journey. He preached in these words, 'Only forty days more and Nineveh is going to be destroyed.' And the people of Nineveh believed in God; they proclaimed a fast and put on sackcloth, from the greatest to the least.

God saw their efforts to renounce their evil behaviour. And God relented: he did not inflict on them the disaster which he had threatened.

Brothers, our time is growing short. As he was walking along by the Sea of Galilee he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net in the lake – for they were fishermen. And Jesus said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you into fishers of men.' And at once they left their nets and followed him.

Going on a little further, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John; they too were in their boat, mending their nets. He called them at once and, leaving their father Zebedee in the boat with the men he employed, they went after him.

4 NEW ADULT CHOIR LEADER BURSARIES (\$2,400 p.a. per leader) AND ANNUAL STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS (\$1,200 p.a. per student)

The Diocese of Sandhurst Chancery is kindly funding four new adult choral leader bursaries (i.e. for 1 Soprano, 1 Alto, 1 Tenor and 1 Bass) and the (8) ongoing student scholarships for students in local schools/colleges (most of these continue from the later primary school grades through to end of Year 12). The 4 new adult choir leader bursaries (for 12 months at a time and awarded after successful audition) are designed to provide principal vocal leadership in each choral section (S, A, T, B) as well as leadership within smaller vocal ensembles at various Cathedral liturgies (e.g. feast day celebrations) and liturgical/musical formation workshops in Bendigo and other regions of the Sandhurst Diocese.
