

PROJECT COMPASSION 2024

3rd Sunday of Lent – 3rd March



This week we follow Jesus to Jerusalem to celebrate the JewisPassover. He enters the temple courts to find men selling cattle, sheep and doves and others sitting at tables exchanging money. He is furious, he makes a whip out of cords and drives all from the temple area, he scatters the coins of money changers, overturns the tables. To those selling doves he says, "Get these out of here! How dare you turn my Father's house into a market!" His frustration with these people is obvious because they have turned a place where people can pray to God, ask for help, or simply be in His presence, into a place of profit and greed. He knows the intricate nature of these people and they have not understood the basic lesson about justice and reverence. "People's hearts are open before God, and nothing can be hidden from his sight". (Lk 8:17)



This week, we meet Leaia from Samoa, who lives with her five children, husband, brother, and sister-in law. They had to rely solely on rainwater and when that ran out, she had to walk with her young children to collect water in buckets and containers from a neighbour down the street. Caritas Australia's local partner Caritas Samoa provided a water tank which was installed in Leaia's home. The time that was previously spent walking to collect water in buckets from a neighbour can now be used for other essential tasks, most importantly, her children don't have to miss out on school. Caritas and the Catholic community have always valued education and have done a great deal to make it accessible for people around the world.

Jesus had insight into the intricate minds of people. He understood human nature, with all its intrigue and complexity and we should try to be the same by listening to people, searching for their potential and looking beneath the surface.

READINGS OF THE DAY

FIRST READING Exodus 20:1-17

A reading from the book of Exodus

God spoke all these words. He said, 'I am the Lord your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery.

'You shall have no gods except me.

'You shall not make yourself a carved image or any likeness of anything in heaven or on earth beneath or in the waters under the earth; you shall not bow down to them or serve them. For I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God and I punish the father's fault in the sons, the grandsons, and the great-grandsons of those who hate me; but I show kindness to thousands of those who love me and keep my commandments.

'You shall not utter the name of the Lord your God to misuse it, for the Lord will not leave unpunished the man who utters his name to misuse it.

'Remember the sabbath day and keep it holy. For six days you shall labour and do all your work, but the seventh day is a sabbath for the Lord your God. You shall do no work on that day, neither you nor your son nor your daughter nor your servants, men or women, not your animals nor the stranger who lives with you. For in six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth and the sea and all that these hold, but on the seventh day he rested; that is why the Lord has blessed the sabbath day and made it sacred.

'Honour your father and your mother so that you may have a long life in the land that the Lord your God has given to you.

'You shall not kill.

'You shall not commit adultery.

'You shall not steal.

'You shall not bear false witness against your neighbour.

'You shall not covet your neighbour's house. You shall not covet your neighbour's wife, or his servant, man or woman, or his ox, or his donkey, or anything that is his.'

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

While the Jews demand miracles and the Greeks look for wisdom, here are we preaching a crucified Christ; to the Jews an obstacle that they cannot get over, to the pagans madness, but to those who have been called, whether they are Jews or Greeks, a Christ who is the power and the wisdom of God. For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength.

GOSPEL John 2:13-25

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market.' Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said.

During his stay in Jerusalem for the Passover many believed in his name when they saw the signs that he gave, but Jesus knew them all and did not trust himself to them; he never needed evidence about any man; he could tell what a man had in him.

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
